MATCH SECRETARY'S REPORT

GENERAL COMPETITIONS

I believe that, in general, the Men's competitions over the past 12 months have run reasonably smoothly.

At the start of last season the sweep fee was raised from £1.50 to £2.00, giving an average prize pot of £150.

Average numbers of entrants for summer competitions was 73, with a maximum of 94.
